Paul G. Orr Award Recipient for 2019

We are honored to present the 2019 Paul G. Orr Award to the Office of Overseas Schools, U.S. Department of State. Kennedy, and for more than 55 years has been working to ensure that the best possible educational opportunities are available for dependents of U.S. Government personnel while stationed abroad. While the Department's primary motivation in supporting schools abroad is to promote quality U.S. educational opportunities, these schools also serve as a means to increase mutual understanding between the people of the United States and those from other countries through the daily demonstration of American educational ideals, principles, and methods.

In following these ideals, the Office of Overseas Schools has not only benefited U.S. government dependents, but has also provided students from the host country and third country nationals with the opportunity to learn English and be schooled in outstanding educational methodologies. In doing this, the Office of Overseas Schools serves globally as one of the best ambassadors of American values and good will. 

Announcing the launch of the Threshold Design Institute



There has never been more opportunity to create unique and compelling teaching and learning environments and experiences. At the same time, there are significant challenges that schools face on an everyday basis that challenge this opportunity. How can a school negotiate this landscape to maximize the opportunity of these possibilities?

We can begin with questions: How might we...

- Build the future now?
- Be the orchestrators of tomorrow, today?
- Transform "school" into an irresistible canvas for learning?
- Be the heart, home, and head of our school communities?
- Pivot to becoming purpose-seekers, passion-finders, and potential-realizers.?
- Honor traditions, amplify strengths, address constraints, and solve for X?
- And accomplish all of this through a strategic human-centered approach to change and improvement?

We are proud to announce the launch of the Threshold Design Institute at the 38th Annual Educators Conference in Monterrey, Mexico. The Institute is a year-long opportunity for member schools to learn the design thinking process, work collaboratively together, and engage their school communities with the design process to answer a question that has high value for them. The experience will be composed of two face-to-face events, with our project launch at this year's pre-conference and culminating with a two-day pre-conference session at the conference next year. Between this time, and throughout the year, the cohort will have the opportunity to engage in monthly webinars to deepen their understanding of the design thinking process, assess and gauge their progress as they work through their design challenge, and engage with each other to support the range of projects of the participating schools. The Institute is led by David Jakes and Brian Hamm.



During the experience, participants will learn the process of design by doing design.

Participants will learn how to develop community inclusive engagement opportunities to gather data and information, develop



design directions based on this information, create design solutions through ideation and prototyping, and learn how to test and improve their designs.

Going beyond the concept of a traditional cohort experience, we imagine the Threshold Design Institute as a dynamic community of innovative educators and school leaders across Latin America who are seeking to engage in multi-disciplinary collaboration to push their professional and school boundaries forward.

At this year's event in Monterrey, we are launching the first cohort of schools that is composed of five schools from El Salvador, Costa Rica, Nicaragua and Mexico. The Institute is an opportunity for schools to learn a human-centered process that can support their ability to become more strategic and innovative in what they do. It is also an opportunity to do this as a community and learn from each other.

John Seely Brown and Ann Pendleton Julian say that design is a process that "operationalizes the imagination." The Institute is committed to providing an opportunity for schools to develop their imagination while at the same time creating strategic solutions to their opportunities through pragmatic action.

The Institute would like to sincerely thank Sonia Keller for her tremendous support of this idea and experience. 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
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
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AP[®] students do college-level work in high school. And if they score a 3 or higher on the exam, they can earn college credit. To help them make the most of this opportunity, we're supporting their teachers with a suite of online tools and introducing new policies for the 2019-20 school year.

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More than half of schools that offer AP ask students to commit to taking the exam in the fall, boosting their chance of earning a score that translates to college credit. We've seen the benefits firsthand.

New Resources

Students will get personalized feedback through new digital tools that provide daily support for every AP classroom. Their teachers will be able to track their performance throughout the year using an online bank of real AP practice questions and monthly personal progress checks.

Your Student's To-Do List

Here is what students need to do to prepare for the 2019-20 AP school year.

THIS SPRING

Students sign up for AP classes at school.

BEFORE THE SCHOOL YEAR

- Students visit apstudent.collegeboard.org to learn more about AP courses and exams.
- Students without a College Board account should create one and set their password. They'll need their username and password when their AP classes start in the fall.
- Students who already have an account should make sure they know their username and password.

FALL 2019

- **First week of class:** Teachers will give students a join code for each of their AP classes. Students use their College Board username and password and join code to enroll in their class section.
- October/November: Schools submit exam orders.

SPRING 2020

- March: Schools submit any changes to their exam order and order exams for students in spring courses.
- May: Students take AP Exams.

SUMMER 2020

• July: AP Exam scores are released.

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
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
